A discussion took place regarding the issuance of raises without a contract and both the Board and the Career staff agreed to investigate it. There is a desire to start doing everything by the book and do it correctly. Then going forward, it will be correct.

Once again, the Chief outlined his recommendation to sell Rescue 24, Engine 20, and Engine 81 and get one new rescue engine that works. He again outlined the proposal that we get a stock engine from Pierce and customize it. It would be here in 6 months and cost a lot less than a custom ordered engine. It would also comply with the current emission standards and not the more expensive ones that will take place in 2027. It would be under \$800,000.

He was again told no for now, because of the budget. So more repairs are still needed once again.

Crew Nights – Chief stated that there were 76 Crew calls last year. Some people are getting fuel vouchers and Clothing Allowance for those nights, as they all contribute towards those totals. We have been struggling for the last 2 weeks. But there should be an incentive, not a part-time job. He suggested \$25 per call or another number that would work.

Tom Braviak contributed an opinion. The company is supposed to have input with this also. It is not an open-ended budget item. Our number may need to be \$15 per call. We can put a cap on it. Back in the day, you got an extra credit point and it wasn't put into the computer but kept on a separate ledger. You could handle the accounting part differently with a different ledger.

We have to look at the 5 to 6 issues, as the firefighter said.

We have to look at other options. People seem to like Mt. Tabor's model. It changes with your certifications.

FF Alex Fidalgo said that night calls might be worth more.

The Chief is going to work on it with his officers and Deputy Chief.

Comm Cobane made a motion to adjourn. Comm. Quinn seconded the motion and it passed by the following vote.
